Sealed Bids for the construction of the <u>Hardin County, Texas – Hurricane Harvey Round 1 – Saratoga Road Improvements, GLO Project No. 20-065-145-C857</u> will be received at the Hardin County Purchasing Department (Attention Misty Sims), 300 West Monroe Street, Kountze, Texas 77625, until 2:00 pm local time on Thursday, March 27, 2025, at which time the Bids received will be publicly opened and read aloud immediately thereafter in the Hardin County Commissioners Courtroom.

There will be a non-mandatory pre-bid conference with the Engineer, Owner, and Prospective Bidders at 1:30 pm on Thursday, March 20, 2025 at the Hardin County Commissioners Courtroom, 300 West Monroe Street, Kountze, Texas 77625.

The Project provides for roadway improvements on Old Sour Lake Road – South, Old Sour Lake Road – North, Pine Lane, and Brown Road within Hardin County, Texas measuring approximately 15,855 linear feet of roadway. The scope of work includes, but not limited to:

- 1. Mobilization
- 2. Removal of existing road surface
- 3. Placement of select structural fill
- 4. Placement of 6" crushed limestone base
- 5. Application of lime treatment (7%)
- 6. Application of cement treatment (6%)
- 7. Placement of prime coat
- 8. Placement of a 1.5" hot-mix asphalt concrete (HMAC)
- 9. Construct driveway turnouts
- 10. Remove and replace culverts
- 11. Barricades, signs and traffic handling

A bid bond in the amount of 5 percent of the bid issued by an acceptable surety shall be submitted with each bid. A certified check or bank draft payable to <u>Hardin County</u>, <u>Texas</u> or negotiable U.S. Government Bonds (as par value) may be submitted in lieu of the Bid Bond.

This project will be financed with assistance from the General Land Office (GLO) under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant — Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program and is subject to all applicable Federal and State laws and regulations. Attention is called to the fact that not less than, the federally determined prevailing (Davis-Bacon and Related Acts) wage rate, as issued by the Texas General Land Office, Disaster Recovery and contained in the contract documents, must be paid on this project. In addition, the successful bidder must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual identity, gender identity, or national origin. Adherence to the County Section 3 Policy is required for contracts and subcontracts in excess of \$100,000.00.

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All contractors and subcontractors must be cleared (not suspended or debarred) prior to any formal action authorizing the award of a contract to the contractor.
